But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith. I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead. Only let us live up to what we have already attained.

- Philippians 3:7-11,16 (New International Version)

When I was a kid, my confirmation teacher, Mrs. McCunn, tried to explain to me the concept of justification according to Wesleyan theology. I was completely lost. The thing that confused me was which came first, our good works or the grace of God? For the longest time, I thought that my ticket to heaven would be punched by all good things that I was doing here on earth. I had lost sight of my own faith. You see, we aren't saved by what we can do. We can't be saved by what we can do. We are saved by faith alone in Jesus Christ, which brings us God's unlimited grace. This grace justifies us (makes us whole) in God's view and brings us into right relationship with the Father, the Son, and the Spirit.

Jesus tells us time and time again that we can't save ourselves, but do we listen? The "Protestant Work Ethic" makes us think we have to earn grace. Unfortunately, we can't do it. Grace is God's alone to share as God sees fit.

All we can do is try to live up to what we have already attained through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection; our own eternal existence. For people are basically told since birth that we have to earn our way in this world, the concept of God's free, abundant, and amazing grace is hard to grasp. "Letting go and letting God" is really, really difficult.

What we can do is respond to the gift of God's grace in our lives. Jesus invites us to follow him and live for others. Once we understand that Jesus' life was a sacrifice for us, then we can begin to respond to the work of God in our lives. Jesus then invites us to give ourselves away so that others may live. This is how God's grace completes its work in us. Jesus calls us to love God with our whole hearts, our whole minds, and our whole strength. God also invites us to love one another with this very same love. As Micah 6:8 says, "What does the LORD require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?"

This Easter season, give yourself away for others. Take a moment to do something unexpected, uninvited, or unthought-of for someone else. God's grace has been poured out on you, so help others experience the love of Christ through your gifts during this season of resurrection. Be Jesus to someone else here and now.

May the resurrection of hope bring about hope in your life,

Hi everyone! May is here! Warm days, flowers, and Mother's Day make this a happy time of year! Richardson Park United Methodist Church is a beautiful and loving place to come, so join us to learn about God's grace. Look for upcoming details in the bulletin about God's Little Angels' annual planting in the Wesley Tower garden! And don't forget - "Shake It Up Café" Vacation Bible School will be happening the last week in June – get ready!

In May, Room 3 will be following Jesus' disciples as they spread the word of God. We will learn about Pentecost in the Book of Acts as we travel to different countries. We also will follow Paul on his journeys as he calls people to be followers of God (Book of Galatians); teaches people to work together to tell of the "Good News" (Acts); and God takes care of those who follow him (Acts). Using songs, Bible stories, felt board, and skits are a great reinforcement! It's wonderful to learn about our awesome God!!! Blessings from Ms. Marlene

Grades 4 thru 8 will be looking at Colossians 3:11 focusing on God's Opinion (Is being liked what matters?); Being Kind (Is being right what really matters); Being Faithful (Is being the best what matters?); and Being Content (Is being happy what matters?).

Grades 9 thru 12 will be finishing its study of Max Lucado's book "He Chose the Nails – What God Did to Claim your Heart" in which we'll discuss God's promises thru the crucifixion. Next we'll be discussing near-death experiences, what are they? How do they affect those that experience them? Are there scientific explanations for them? How is God experienced or perceived in near-death experiences? Implications from near-death experiences and what can we learn from them? And if there's time, we'll watch a DVD called the Case for Christ in which an investigative journalist, Lee Strobel, tells about his compelling search for knowledge that led him from a life of atheism to faith by examining the historical accuracy of the Gospels, the personal claims of Jesus and His resurrection from the Dead..

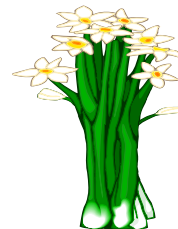
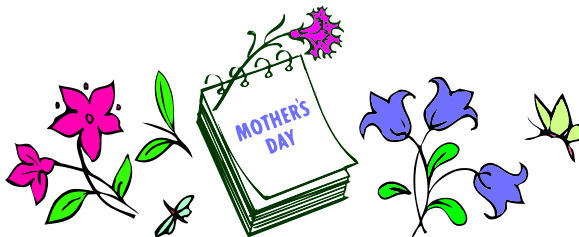
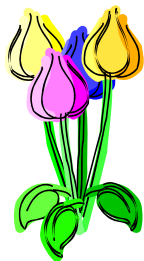
