

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Will there be a blast of snow before winter gives up its hold on the region? I, as some of you may know, am very happy to see several inches or more fall. I never get the feeling that we have had winter if there is not at least one storm that covers everything over with snow. Christy laughs at me when I don't consider it a proper snow if the tips of the grass are still showing. I know I would have difficulty living in Florida or some other non-snowy state. I am a winter person. This is not to say that I don't like the other seasons. I am always delighted to see the flowers bursting from the ground around the church and at home. It amazes me that bulbs can lie dormant for the entire winter and then, by some miracle, know when to spring up. They get taller by the day and soon these new sprouts will have buds that will form the beautiful flowers that we enjoy so much.

What is hidden dormant within you that can spring forth this season and become a beautiful thing? Unlike flowers, we have to give these hidden treasures a nudge sometimes. In Corinthians, Paul tells us that anyone who is in Christ is a new creation - just like the flowers that appear in the springtime. I encourage you during this season of Lent to gaze hard into deep recesses of your soul and gently nudge something within you to burst up through the ground of your life. Embrace the uncertainty of trying something new! Try something different in your spiritual life. If you're are accustomed to praying on a regular basis and don't do too much studying of the Bible, add that in. Take a step out of your normal comfort zone and that might provide the impetus for your flowers—your hidden treasures— to grow.

Ash Wednesday was February 14, but there's still plenty of opportunities to worship in this Lenten season and I hope you will join me in inviting God into our lives as we continue to celebrate and commit to the life of Jesus Christ. That said, I'm asking each of you to put on your calendar our shared Good Friday service on March 29 at noon at Penial UMC. I'm even boldly asking you to potentially say, "No" to something else in order to be with your church family that day. I know lots of things pull at you and grab for your attention but our spiritual journey is vitally important. This service will help complete the picture that began on Ash Wednesday and culminate with our Easter celebration on Sunday March 31 at 10:30am. Easter will mean so much more to you as you deepen your faith walk and understanding of the life, death and resurrection of our Lord.

- 6) March 31: Easter worship


I hope to see you at some of these activities.

TECHNOLOGY TIPS

Years ago, I read a book titled “The Assault on Privacy”. It has long since gone out of print, but the message is still relevant. The book was recommended to me but with a warning that if I read the book, I would never want to provide personal information again. Naturally, I did not believe it, so I ordered a copy and read it. The warning was grossly understated.

The book was well researched and eye opening. Here is why.

The book discusses what happens to your information once you hand it over. It’s a commodity which can be bought and sold. Examples of collectors are Google, Amazon, Facebook, numerous government agencies, and social media systems. Google tracks your movements and classifies the sites you visit. Amazon can track your interests through what you read, watch, and buy. What you buy, where you go, when you go, your likes and dislikes are all stored in a database and traded on the open market.

Keep these things in mind the next time you give out personal information. Protect your privacy.




