

TECHNOLOGY TIPS

Microsoft One Drive


OneDrive offers features that help protect data and make it available to all your devices. There are some precautions to consider however to protect the data.

First, to use OneDrive the user must have and use a Microsoft logon. OneDrive uses that ID to access the "cloud" server. The ID needs to be used by each of your devices.

OneDrive needs to decide what data is important. It will copy key folders used by most people. This includes the desktop contents, the documents folder, and the photo directory. One key part of the process is OneDrive does not copy your data to the cloud, but it moves it. This means your data no longer resides on your hard drive. It is very difficult to copy the data back or to have it exist in both locations.

Once the data is moved the owner no longer has complete control of the information. OneDrive controls it. Changing how One Drive works can cause loss of data if you are not careful. One significant situation to be aware of is NEVER use your Microsoft ID to access your data on someone else's computer. If you do that OneDrive may be able to sync with the data directories on the new host computer.














The purpose of Richardson Park United Methodist Church is to help people experience the amazing love of God and develop a vital relationship with Jesus Christ.
