THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Holy are you, O God, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. By the baptism of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection you gave birth to your church, delivered us from the slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

On the night in which Jesus gave himself up for us he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: *"Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."*

When the supper was over he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: *"Drink from this all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."*

And so in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving, as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here and on these symbols of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ so that we are for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes again in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet.

Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **Amen.**

O Lord God, hear the hearts of your people as they pray:

Merciful Lord, we do not presume to come to your table trusting in our own righteousness, but in your manifold and great mercies. Have mercy upon us for your Son Jesus' sake, and forgive all that is past. Please grant that we may participate in this sacrament of your Son, Jesus the Christ, and afterward walk in newness of life, serving and pleasing you, growing more into the likeness of Jesus, and evermore dwelling in him as he dwells in us. Amen.

As the Lord now bids you to come, with the confidence of children, let us pray as Jesus taught, saying, **“Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory forever, Amen.”**

Christ our Lord invites-to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin, who seek to live in peace with one another, and who intend to lead a life of holiness following the commandments of God - all as best you can. So come now and take this Holy Sacrament to your comfort.
